

REFRACTION (GLASSES CHECK) SERVICE AND FEE

A refraction is the process of determining if there is a need for corrective eyeglasses, or a change in a current eyeglass prescription. It is an essential part of an eye examination and necessary to write a prescription for glasses.

Medicare and most medical insurance plans do *NOT* cover routine refractions. Insurances allow us to charge separately for that portion of the examination, since it is not a covered service.

Our office fee for a refraction is \$50.00 and this fee is collected at the time of service for all Medicare patients. For all other insurances, we will bill the insurance company first. If the insurance company does not pay, the patient is responsible.
